**REQUEST TO MOVE FORWARD WITH PREVIOUSLY-ABATED CASE  
(CDC MORATORIUM)**

I, \_\_\_\_\_ Plaintiff, do wish to proceed with this case which was previously abated under the Supreme Court’s Emergency Orders related to the CDC Moratorium.

- I request this case to be set for an eviction trial.
- There is already a judgment for possession in this case, and I request issuance and execution of a writ of possession.

- I acknowledge and understand that there is a federal eviction moratorium issued by the CDC, currently scheduled to expire on June 30, 2021.
- I acknowledge and understand that this moratorium creates civil and criminal liabilities for landlords who evict tenants who are protected by the order\*\*

**\*\*Under 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571; 42 U.S.C. 271 and 42 CFR 70.18, a person violating this Order may be subject to a fine of no more than \$100,000 or one year in jail, or both, if the violation does not result in a death, or a fine of no more than \$250,000 or one year in jail, or both if the violation results in a death, or as otherwise provided by law. An organization violating this Order may be subject to a fine of no more than \$200,000 per event if the violation does not result in a death or \$500,000 per event if the violation results in a death or as otherwise provided by law. The U.S. Department of Justice may initiate criminal proceedings as appropriate seeking imposition of these criminal penalties\*\***
